Accommodations

Kaibab Lodge Cabins

Accommodations include rustic Kaibab Lodge cabins (21 beds are available) or nearby camping at the Demotte Campground.

Breakfasts, bag lunches, and dinners are provided for all attendees, whether you are camping or staying in a cabin.

When you register, you will be asked to list the names of those whom you would prefer to share a cabin or campsite with.



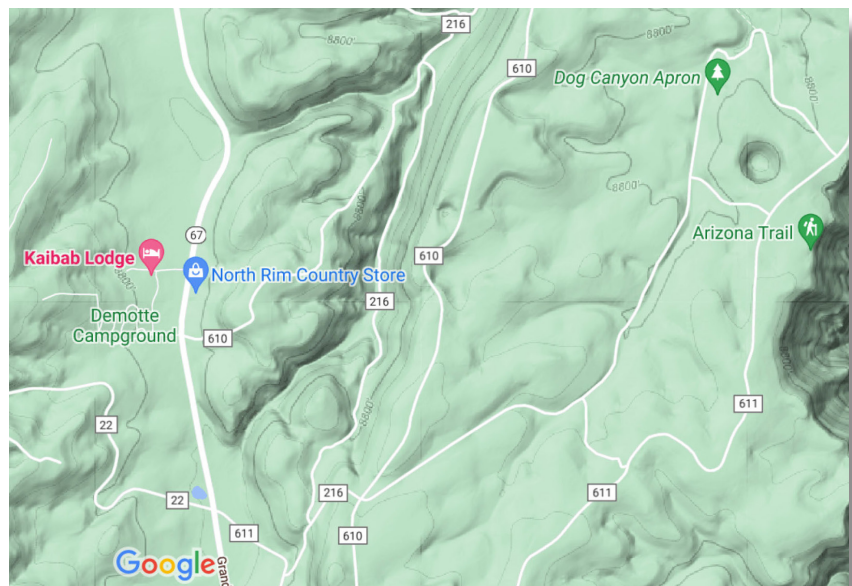

Camping at DeMotte Campground

AHS has reserved 8 campsites in the DeMotte Campground, Kaibab National Forest, with estimated capacity to accommodate 18 registered field trip participants. Campsite registration will be closed as the total number of registrations reaches 18. The AHS Campsite Coordinator will then use the information you provide to assign the campsites, to optimize for one camper vehicle and one or two tents per site. **A daytime phone number is requested so the coordinator may contact you if additional information is needed.**



- 1) Campsite registrants will not be permitted to camp with an unregistered guest.
- 2) Single campers will likely be assigned a shared campsite with up to two other field trip participants.
- 3) For those who prefer to camp as a small group, registrants can enter a list of names in their group. This information will be used to assign the group the same or adjacent sites.
- 4) Each campsite will accommodate one camping van, pickup w/camper shell, or short RV (total length no more than 25 ft). Generators are allowed between 6 AM and 10 PM.
- 5) One -camper/RV type vehicle per site will be assigned on a first-come-first-served basis until one per site is taken. No utility hookups are available.
- 5) Each site will accommodate one or two vehicles for tent campers, and one or two tent sites. Tent camping assignments will be based upon tent occupancy information.
- 6) Campsite amenities include: Picnic table, fire ring, one improved tent pad, and one or two primitive tent pads. The campground has three shared vault toilets. There is no cell phone reception.

Transportation

Personal vehicles will be used for transportation to Demotte Campground, Kaibab Lodge, and field trip destinations. Some voluntary carpooling may be needed to reduce vehicle congestion at some of the backcountry sites on North Rim. That will be coordinated once the Field School begins.

When registering, please select from the following options:

Option A: Meet at a location TBD in Flagstaff on Friday, June 17 at 9:45 AM. Depart at 10:30 AM and caravan in personal vehicles to the USFS Visitor Center at Jacob Lake, arriving at 2:00 PM. The field trip will officially begin after we depart Jacob Lake.

Option B: Meet at the USFS Kaibab Plateau Visitor Center at Jacob Lake at 2:00 PM. The Field School will make 2 field trip stops between Jacob Lake and the Kaibab Lodge.

Guests may check-in to the cabins at 4:00 PM. Some may not have cellular service after Jacob Lake.
